Advocate for or against ballot initiatives, constitutional amendments, or legislation with a stated USCCB or CCO Position



Engage in non-partisan voter education which is:

- Consistent with Church teaching
- Covers a wide range of issues
- Exhibits no candidate or party bias
- Is approved by your diocese





## Don'ts

- Don't Endorse or Oppose Candidates, Political Parties, or Groups of Candidates
- Don't Authorize or Distribute
  Partisan Political Materials
- Don't Use Church Facilities or Assets to Support, Promote, Endorse, or Oppose Any Political Party or Candidate
- Don't Give Church Money or Support to Candidates for Political Office or to Officeholders

## **Guiding Principle:**

Only share resources provided by the USCCB, Catholic Conference of Ohio, or your local diocesan office.
